MySIS	MySIS is your student information system.
	For PGRs, MySIS is primarily used for recording
	your supervision meeting logs. You can also
	use MySIS to update your personal
	information with the university, e.g., to update
	your address if you move.
Office365	Office 365 is a Microsoft product offering an
	online version of Office. Queen Mary uses
	Office 365 as the provider of all staff and
	student Office accounts.

CPD Training System	The <u>CPD Training System</u> is Queen Mary's
	central system for booking, recording and
	monitoring Continuous Professional Development (CPD) activities for staff and
	postgraduate research (PGR) students.

	As a PGR, you are required to complete the
	Research Integrity Essentials course on the
	CPD system before your first year review.

Skills Points Plug-in	The Skills Points Plug-in is part of the <u>CPD</u>
	<u>Training System.</u>
	To access your Skills Point Record via the plug-
	in, log into the CPD Training System and select
	'Skills Points' from the top menu.

	training and development activities that are
	not automatically added to your record.
