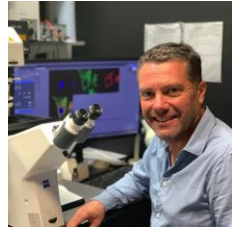

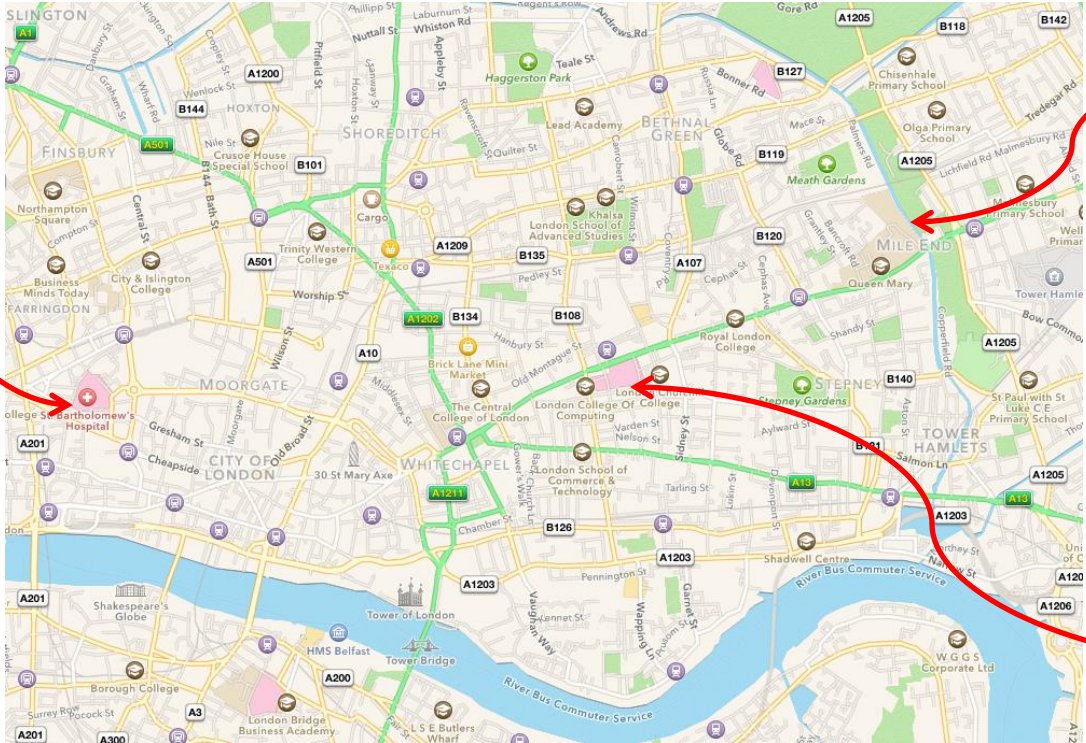

What FMD expects from you

- Courteous and professional conduct towards all Staff and Students
- To be ambassadors for the Faculty
- To contribute to the research standing of the Faculty
- To complete your PhD in the agreed time period

What FMD expects from you

- We want you to succeed hence the monitoring process
- A pleasant and stimulating environment
- Doctoral development training
 - to aid your employability

What is a PhD Thesis?

- The thesis must form a distinct contribution to knowledge of the subject and afford evidence of originality, shown by the discovery of new facts or by the exercise of independent critical power.
- Be of a standard to merit publication in whole or in part or in a revised form (for example, as a monograph or as a number of articles in learned journals).
- Be the work of the candidate

The important milestones in your full-time (and part-time) study

- Year 1 - 9 month report (18m)
- Year 2 - 18 month report (36m)
- Year 3 - 30 month report (60m)
- Year 4 - 39 months: submit thesis (75m)
 - MUST be completed (submitted) by 48 months (84m)
- For your 9m, 18m and 30m report you will meet and discuss with an internal review panel.
- Transferable skills training – Queen Mary skill points 210 hours

Transferable Skills from the PhD

- Technical research skills
- Information searching skills
- Turning your hand to a range of technical and data analysis challenges
- Project management skills
- Presentation skills
- Networking skills
- Teaching/instruction of others
- Working to schedules
- Your career management

Extensions and Interruptions

- Normally maximum period of registration is 4 years (7 years part-time).
- At the end of this period you will be de-registered unless you request an extension.
- If at any point in your PhD studies you have a problem, eg personal or medical, that will stop you from being able to work at your project for a period of longer than 4 weeks you can request an interruption of studies or an extension of study period.
- Total interruption may be for up to 2 years, with up to 1 year agreed at any one time.
- Decision is made by Research Degrees Programmes and Examination Board.
- You request an extension or interruption through your supervisor and DGS with documentary evidence.
- Do NOT wait to request. Board does not want to penalise students with genuine problems and is supportive.
