

1905 The East London Technical College has a new aim to promote Higher Education in East London

1934 East London College becomes Queen Mary College

1989 Queen Mary College merges with Westfield College to become Queen Mary and Westfield College

1995 Queen Marv and Westfield College merges with Barts and the Royal **London School** of Medicine

2005 Queen Mary and Westfield College changes its name to Queen Mary University of London

2012 QMUL joins the Russell Group













Many of Queen Mary's foundations can be traced back to our philanthropic origins of bringing education to the east end.

These foundations are evident today:

- Champions public engagement, and research that makes a contribution to both the international research community and local people
- We are a 'civic university' that champions local agendas and seeks to strengthen communities.
- We support local schools St. Paul's Way Trust and Drapers' Multi-Academy Trust
- Seeks to foster a vibrant but inclusive research community



So where are we now?



- ca. 27,000 students including ~2000 PhD students and ~4600 staff
- Working in 3 Faculties: Humanities and Social Sciences, Science and Engineering, and Medicine and Dentistry
- Across 5 campuses: at Mile End, Whitechapel, Charterhouse Square, West Smithfield, and Lincoln's Inn Fields
- Also, one of the world's 20 most international universities with students from 170 different countries, and 35% of staff born outside of the UK



A Research Intensive University



- 9 Nobel Prize winners among former staff and students
- Ranked 92nd in the world and 9th the UK by U.S. News & World Report 'Best Global Universities 2024'.
- ~£130m annual research income
- Ranked joint 7th in the UK for quality of research in 2021 Research Excellence Framework (REF)
- Ranked 14th in the world for the quality of our research, THE World Ranking 2024
- Top 10 in the UK for a number of subjects including: Drama, Film, Computer Science & Informatics, Politics & International Studies, Engineering, Economics and History
- A member of the Russell Group of research intensive universities
- Ranked 1st in the Russell Group and 3rd among UK universities for social mobility
- First university to receive a Platinum Engage Watermark from National Co-ordinating Centre for Public Engagement

Funding for research:

The Doctoral College holds two types of research funding.

Postgraduate Research Fund (PGRF)

Doctoral College Initiative Fund (DCIF)


£1000 for funded projects at QMUL to support PGRs to deliver initiatives like conferences and network meetings at QMUL.
