

East London Research Network (ELRN)

• Internal network to bring together academic colleagues working on research in, with and for East London across QM's three faculties.

East London Civic Action Network (ELCAN)

 Convening a network of East London external stakeholders and QM staff, academics, students and alumni around our civic themes for further collaboration and action together.



East London Research Network

- To support interdisciplinary research in East London by facilitating exchange and new collaborations
- To share information about members' research interests; internal and external funding opportunities; publications, reports, datasets and other outputs; and activities and events relevant to researchers working in East London.
- To facilitate collaborations and partnerships with communities, organisations, policy makers and other partners in East London, including through themed meetings on research and civic priorities and a shared commitment to equitable partnership work.
