2023.041[a]	Annual schedule of business for 2024–25 [FIC23/35] The Committee asked whether it could receive a deep dive on the University's investment policy over the coming year. The current policy had been developed with input from students and we had previously had a session between the fund managers and students to discuss how the funds are managed. We would explore the option of holding a further session for students with the investment managers.	Chief Financial Officer	The University has offered engagement with our investment fund managers to students. It is important this engagement opportunity is offered to a broad of students.
